
Photography, designing furniture and then having it built to his specs, Toastmasters, and traveling with his wife to parts unknown keep him busy.

TREAT DON'T RETREAT

Jim, a tall, slender, clean-cut manager, joined Toastmasters with the intent of improving his public speaking

ability. He was a charter member of a newly formed club. Like many of us, he was uncomfortable standing before an audience to deliver a speech. He lacked the confidence and the know-how. When he stepped into the room for his first meeting he accepted the challenge to place his doubts and fears on hold. He treated himself to the Toastmasters experience with the expectation of a positive outcome.

Jim worked his Competent
Communication manual from
the first speech to the tenth
speech. Most of his earlier
speeches were somewhat
impersonal. He told us about
his favorite gadgets and toys.
However, somewhere along
his journey a transformation
happened. Jim got personal.
His tenth speech was a touching
story about his early battle with
dyslexia and how it shaped

his life. The audience listened with rapt attention. There was a startling difference between Jim's first and tenth speeches. Such is the positive outcome offered by Toastmasters.

As we wind down 2011 and look toward 2012, let's be reminded of the decision we made to challenge ourselves to become more confident and proficient speakers. We chose to do that by treating ourselves to a membership in Toastmasters – an organization with an 87 year history of members accomplishing what we committed to do.

Why do these members achieve positive outcomes? It's simply because they commit to three basic actions:

- 1) They Start
- 2) They Surrender
- 3) They Stay

First, members are successful because...

They Start. Toastmasters makes it easy for us to start don't they? You pay your dues. They send you the Start-up kit. You're ready to go, right? Right! Everything you need to get started is outlined in that kit, but we all know you can't satisfy hunger without eating

some food. The food is not the kit. The food is...working the program.

Next, members are successful because...

They Surrender. The program works. You don't have to start from scratch. You just need to commit to working the program. When you work the program the program works for you. In order for that to happen vou have to surrender two tightly held personal doctrines. The first one is holding on to your self-limiting belief that you can't become a better speaker. The second one is holding on to the belief that you have to be perfect to be effective. Holding on to these two beliefs is like trying to swim in the Pacific Ocean in a straitjacket. It's easy to dive in but hard to swim out. By surrendering, you trust yourself to stumble knowing that you can swim out by taking the next step.

Last, members are successful because...

They Stay. I love this quote by Helen Blanchard, the first woman in Toastmasters and the first woman President of Toastmasters International,

"When you get out of Toastmasters all you can get out of Toastmasters...

you'll never get out of Toastmasters."

Sometimes members don't realize working the program is all about fighting through their *inside call* to retreat. You know the call - that nagging voice to quit, to give up, to retreat. **Instant success rarely happens in life.** It is earned through the consistent application of *next steps* toward a desired goal. Fortunately the Toastmasters program has all of the next steps laid out for you. You follow them at your own *uncomfort level*. Toastmasters is a treat when you don't retreat. When members keep going; they keep growing.

So, if this article finds you at a point of retreat or indecision; let me assure you that you would not have made the initial commitment if you didn't have a yearning to become a better speaker. You had that yearning because the voice you house is crying, "I'm your gift to the world. Somebody needs to hear me. Let me out!" Don't disappoint those waiting to hear from you. Don't disappoint yourself. Don't discount the gift of your voice.

Let 2012 be your year to achieve the positive outcome you desire. Treat, don't retreat! That's what Jim did.
